The work of the Gweimen Centre in a small village in Nigeria can seem insignificant to some, especially in the face of so much tragedy and hardship. Yet, the work matters, and to some it is a matter of life and death.

Recently, the Executive Director, Dr. Beatrice Kadangs, and some of the staff went to local villages to do outreach and education. The nurse gave health talks to more than 200 widows, also conducting medical tests and administering medication.

One young widow came to one of these outreach meetings. She had experienced so much loss – four of her six children had died. Her husband was dead. She had malaria, typhoid fever, depression and other emotional issues. Her two living children, ages 9 and 1, were malnourished and suffered from water borne illnesses. Her situation was desperate.

The Gweimen nurse started to help them, visiting often, administering medications, and bringing food. That woman is now improving every day. She is cooking and caring for her children again. She is singing and praising God for the miraculous intervention of the Gweimen Centre and its staff.

As a result there is much rejoicing in the entire village and surrounding area. This incredible turn around in her life is one

that illustrates in a powerful way the work of Gweimen. It also will increase the number of people who will come for help. And God will receive the glory.

The Daily Work

More than 40 children show up everyday after school for lunch and after school programs. Women come for vocational training on a daily basis, learning baking and sewing and other income generation skills. Several widows have started their own businesses as a result. Because of a recent donation of medications, the nurse is conducting regular visits to local communities.
